## A VICTORY AT THE BURG.

Their first league game a victory. This is the way that Manager Frank Babcock's Tecumseh have started out this season in the Intermediate C. L. A. series. Chatham has at last got a team who are worthy of the name of first class lacrosse players and their victory over Wallaceburg yesterday was only a hint of what will come later in the season. It was the strongest team that ever played a Chatham uniform and they were well and were ably supported by the Chatham enthusiasts. The final score was 6-2 for the Maple City boys.

The special train left Chatham at 2:30 and the game started in Wallaceburg at 4:08. Corey Hess, of Bradford, was the referee, and he was called upon over twenty times to send players to the fence. Mr. Hess is no doubt a superb goal keeper, but the general impression is that his strongest position on the field is as a player and not as a referee. There were several fouls called and there was great complaint about some of the decisions.

One disgraceful feature of the game was the crowd. It was thought that Chatham had experienced sufficient of this sort of treatment in Wallaceburg, but Wallaceburg seems to be holding up their end of the year in point of crowd interference. It was certainly the little boys' day, for there were "scrap" galore, and the referee was forced to enter in his report "disgraceful conduct from the Wallaceburg spectators." It is Wallaceburg is to encourage lacrosse at their town they will have to have better conduct from their crowd.

There is no doubt about the game being rough. Taylor started it off and went to the fence for three minutes. He was sent there four or five times during the game, and at last the referee sent him off for good. Eames, Carter, McFarlane, Huntington, Kirkwood, Grace and Rowe all found positions on the fence, and many of these several times.

Carter scored the first goal in 16 minutes and the first quarter ended 1-0 for Chatham.

In the second quarter, Wallaceburg scored in four minutes, and Stewart for Chatham scored in 11 minutes. This quarter ended 2-1 for Chatham.

In the third quarter, McFarlane for the Tecumseh scored in a minute and a half and Quessel put in another hot one for Chatham. This made the score 4-1.

In the fourth quarter Quessel scored again in four minutes on a flying shot after passing three or four men. He was sent to the fence for six minutes.

The work of the Tecumseh was good and a fast game may be expected here next Friday. The Tecumseh defense was perfect and the home players well together, especially during the latter part of the game.

Carter was undoubtedly the star player on the field, but he was not far ahead of Walter Elliott, the sturdy defense man. Walter was in the game from the start to the finish.

Hayden was also in the game, and this is sufficient to say that he played well. Quessel started during the latter portion of the game; he put in a couple of dummies.

Pickering showed up well; he is an ideal cover point. Manager Babcock certainly knows the good ones.

McFarlane caught well and shot like a fiend; he looks good from every point of view.

Manager Babcock's men do not drink intoxicating liquors and positively refused to play in Chicago vs. Detroit on a Sunday. Both these cities went Sunday games but Manager Babcock says nay, nay.

Frank J. Grace showed his value as an all round home fielder. No thing in the league has anything on Frank in this line.
