The bazaar in which the fire broke ont was a temporary structure of wood. The flames were first discovered above the stall occupied by the Duchess d'Uzet and while the place was densely crowded with workingmen. A terrible panic and crush followed the alarm of fire. There was a wild rush for the exits and the weaker persons were trampled on after having been knocked down in the stampede. The inflammable nature of the building and its contents caused the flames to spread with great rapidity and in a very short time the bazaar was a mass of flames. The bodies of thirty victims, mostly women, were afterwards recovered and laid out on the sidzwalk, where the corpses formed a ghastly spectacle. Many people, however, are atill missing, and, it is feared, they are buried in the ruins. Later dates give the number killed or died since from the result of their injuries at 150.
