

Items.

The fishing schooner Osceola, which sailed for the Banks yesterday, returned to port this afternoon in a disabled condition. It appears that about 4 a.m. this morning, while the Osceola was running along with a fresh breeze and thick fog, as usual, she collided with an enormous iceberg, carrying her jibboom and bowsprit and starting her windlass. The schooner was about 41 miles off Cape Spear at the time of the accident.—Ibid.

The hon Robert Thorburn has kindly favoured us with the following information, condensed from the report of Capt. Field of the steamer Leopard. The Leopard left Cupids on the 7th June, bound to Mannois Island and leading Tickle, Labrador; with fish crews. She fell in with ice near Belle Isle, and steamed through heavy ice to Sloop Cove, where she anchored on the 12th June, seeing no prospect of proceeding further until June 21st, when she again started and reached Long Tickle on the same day, where she landed crews and proceeded to Mannois Island, arriving there on the 22d having landed crews, salt and provisions, she started on her return on the 28th. The Susan, Capt. Smith, arrived at Mannois Island on the 26th June, and the steamship Panther at Turnavic Island on the 23rd.

The Leopard came up in shore from Mannois Island through loose ice as far as Wolf Islands. Not a ice till about of C. Charles, where there was a belt of heavy ice. Saw a number of craft on Tuesday last between Wolf Island and Cape Charles, and spoke some of them, who informed Capt. Field they had been harbored in Scrammy and Spence Islands, and had got no sign of fish. Those were the first craft seen on their way to the fishing grounds. Met another fleet of craft passing Size's Harbor on the following day, which had harbored in Quirpon for some time, waiting for the ice to go off.

From the winds lately prevalent Capt. Field thinks the ice will now be far enough off to admit of navigation all the way along the coast of Labrador, but up to a week ago cold easterly winds and weather had prevailed, keeping the ice near the land and preventing vessels making progress north.

This report differs a little from that of last year, when the Leopard was engaged on a similar service and got back to St. John's on the 7th July, nearly a week later than this year; and the voyage of 1879, as we all know proved one of the best on record, so that there is no reason why a like favorable result may not attend the operations of the present season. The earliest fishing season are not always as a rule the best.—Jureat.

On one day last week, we are informed, a cod seine at Petty Harbour took about 300 qts codfish. At all events the results in cod's heads, for manuring purposes, was thirty seven loads!—Ibid

The steamer Bear, on her passage from Sydney, was on shore for about two hours near St. Shotts. She was got off without much difficulty, and arrived here on Friday P.M. her damage is very slight, and can be quickly repaired.—Ibid

The Plover returned from Cape Race on Saturday evening, bringing Captain Shadrake, of the steamer F. W. Harris, his officers and crew. The Captain's wife and family also came by the Plover. The steamer, from Cardiff, June 24 for Montreal, went on shore six miles east of Cape Race, July 1st, her bow well up on the rocks and her stern submerged in fifteen fathoms of water. The vessel belongs to private company, and is a total loss.
