IS "SHADOWS OF THE PAST."

The attendance at the Nickel Thea-
tre last evening was very large, and
all were delighted with the films and
music. This evening there is an en-
tire change of programme, and there
is something to interest everyone.
The principal picture is "Shadows of
the Past" by the Vitagraph artists.
It is a masterpiece by the same all-
star cast which produced the "Mil-
lion Bid." The Keystone comedians
will be seen in a two-reel picture en-
titled "The Girl from New York." The
Hearst-Selig News Pictorial shows
the ruins of Malines Cathedral, Belgian
refugees in England and other very
interesting scenes. It is a
splendid show this evening and none
should miss it.

10,000 Women Volunteers

Already more than 10,000 women
have responded to the Government's
call for women volunteers to do the
work of men who are of military age.
"Everyone is most anxious to do
something," said one of the principal
women officials of the Labor Exchange,
"but the great difficulty is to discover
what they are best fitted for. It will
take at least a week to classify the
volunteers."

"Most of the women want to go into
ammunition factories. I want to make
bullets to kill Germans," said one girl.
Quite a large number of women in the
southwest of England are prepared
to do agricultural work. One woman
of good social position, who drives her
own car, has offered to take milk
around. Many are anxious to become
taxicab drivers, and one has sent her
photograph in chauffeur's uniform.
To-day several women who are qual-
ified wireless operators volunteered to
go to sea in merchant vessels, so that
the men operators may be released
for naval work.

"The women of Woolwich have come
forward in a large body, and almost
without exception they want to go into
munition factories."

"The average age of the applicants
is between twenty and thirty, but
some are seventeen and others sixty."
Any woman who is ready to take
up work has only to register herself
at the nearest Labor Exchange, or
she can get a form of registration by
post from headquarters of the Labor
Exchanges at Queen Anne's chambers,
Westminster, S.W., or from local
Labor Exchanges.

At the meeting of the Essex Edu-
cation Committee in London it was
decided to release Dr. F. S. Hawks, a
school medical inspector, who desired
to take a commission, and to appoint
in his place during the war Mrs.
Leitch, a woman doctor, whose hus-
band was serving at the front and
who desired herself to help the coun-
try.—London Daily Mail.

is a Corporal in the 14th Battalion of
the Victoria Rifles and was one of
the first Newfoundlanders to enlist
abroad.

SEALFISHERY DEFICIT.—To out-
fit our sealing fleet of thirteen ships
for this year's sealing voyage, cost in
the neighborhood of \$220,000, this
enormous outlay being made neces-
sary owing to the wireless equipment
each steamer had to be supplied
with. It is therefore apparent that
the returns of the voyage will not
reach but a fraction of the outlay and
that those directly interested will
meet with heavy deficits.

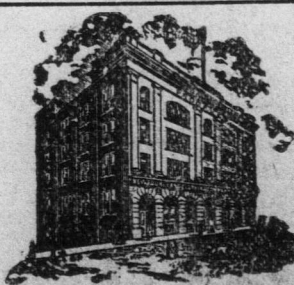
