### Tax on Dowries

Rejected Plan to Stop U.S. Heiresses Marrying Titled Foreigners.

In the House of Representatives recently, Mr. Blanton (Texas) endeavoured, through an amendment to the Tax Bill, to become a protector of American heiresses against titled foreigners. He declared that it was time to stop title-holders romping off with American beauties

Mr. Blanton proposed a tax levy of 99 per cent, on the dowry in such marriages and an inheritance tax of 75 per cent, on any pertion of an estate left to legatees living abroad.


