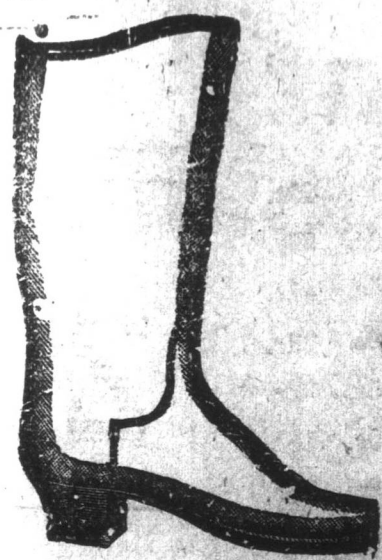

## No Home Rule For India

British Government's Fate in Balance at Last Night's Session—McDonald will Appeal to Country if Defeated—Rumanias' King in Danger—Coal Miners Wage Dispute Settled.

### MACDONALD FACING

### ANOTHER CRISIS.

LONDON, May 29.

That the Government's fate was in the balance in to-night's debate in the Commons, with the issue doubtful, was admitted by the Daily Herald, Labor's organ, while all political writers concur in the declaration that the administration will find itself in a tighter corner than ever before, and can in any case expect only a small majority. The debate centres around a motion by Conservatives to reduce the salary of Tom Shaw, Minister of Labor, this being a technical way of disapproving the Government's policy toward relieving unemployment. A similar motion was talked out in the House a week ago, the Government and supporters preventing closure by the majority of 34. Everything apparently hinges upon the advice Asquith gives his followers at to-day's Liberal caucus, and several experts believe this advice will favor the Government.

### DEFEAT MEANS APPEAL

### TO COUNTRY.

LONDON, May 29.

Prime Minister MacDonald, in a speech before the Commons to-day clearly stated that if the Government was defeated on the motion to reduce the salary of Minister of Labor Shaw it would go at once to the country.

### HOME RULE FOR INDIA NOT YET.

LONDON, May 29.

The British Government is unprepared to make any proposal at present towards the extension of Home Rule in India, it was announced by J. R. Clynes, Deputy Minister, in the House of Commons, in answering a question in the House this afternoon.

### COAL DISPUTE SETTLED.

LONDON, May 29.

The prolonged dispute over the question of the coal miners' wages was definitely settled to-day, when a full conference of the coal miners' delegates voted 473 to 311 to accept the terms of the agreement reached by the miners' federation representatives with the owners on May 15.

### HOLY YEAR.

Pope Pius to-day issued a Bull proclaiming 1925 a holy year. Besides granting the usual indulgences for the jubilee, the Pope prays for the real pacification of the world, for re-union of the churches, dissonant from the church of Rome, and for the systematization of the offices of Palestine according to Catholic rites.

### EPINARD AGAIN BEATEN.

PARIS, May 29.

The crack French four year old, was beaten at Longchamps race this afternoon on his first appearance.

### NARROW ESCAPE OF RUMANIA'S KING.

LONDON, May 29.

King Ferdinand of Rumania is reported by the Bucharest correspondent of the Daily Express to have narrowly escaped death during a long series of explosions which occurred in the central ammunition depot, two miles west of the Rumanian capital yesterday. The King approached so near the arsenal that General Maderesco was obliged to drag him away and a shell fell and exploded on the spot where he had been standing. It is believed several were killed in the explosion and fire which followed.

### MACLAREN MAY RESUME FLIGHT.

HAKODATE, Japan, May 29.

The United States destroyer, John Paul Jones, left here to-day for Hong Kong with Stuart MacLaren's spare airplane, to substitute for the one destroyed in India, breaking his world encircling attempt. Another destroyer will rush the plane from Hong Kong to India and it is hoped that the flight might be resumed.

### BOMB ACCIDENT.

KURUMAN, Bechuanaland, May 29.

While a review of military commands was in progress here yesterday a bomb fell accidentally from a military demonstrating airplane into a crowd of spectators, killing six persons outright and injuring nineteen.

### TO RE-COMMISSION THE ENCHANTRESS.

LONDON, May 29.

A statement made in the House of Commons by Charles Ammon, Parliamentary Secretary of the Admiralty, relative to a question whether the Admiralty yacht Enchantress was to be put in commission, again in ten days, to allow the Board of Admiralty officially to attend the review of the fleet in July, and to inspect the ships, led to a torrent of questions being asked. George Lansbury, Labor member, wanted to know why the Labor Government required a yacht when the Coalition Government had laid it up. Secretary Ammon replied that it was the Admiralty which required the yacht and that the cost of re-commissioning would be \$700,000.

### ANOTHER GRAFT ARREST.

WASHINGTON, May 29.

David C. Keer, United States Vice Consul at Vancouver, was arrested here to-day on a charge of having accepted bribes to influence his decisions on questions relating to the passage of aliens across the Canadian border.
