

...AM WORK IN ERIN.—A correspondent writes us to say that the crops in that township are generally looking well, and since the latter rains are progressing favorably. The fall wheat looks remarkably well. Perhaps in no previous year was there so much fall wheat in this township, nor did it ever look better than it does this season. Spring work is well advanced. There is a great scarcity of feed all over the township, but the late rains will soon enable farmers to put their stock on the grass.

Guelph Markets.

Receipts of grain continue light, but there is a prospect of improvement, as there is no doubt a considerable quantity still held in the country. Wheat has tumbled during the week, fall having come down six and spring seven cents. Of peas there are but few offerings and the price is steady. There is little or no barley coming in, and the quotations are nominal. Oats have an upward tendency; eggs and butter are easier. Hay has come down to something like its proper value now that cattle can live without it. Potatoes are not brought in by farmers, probably for the good reason that they have none to spare, but various consignments have been made from Michigan to merchants in town. The price of the excellent is somewhat firmer than last week. Wool is beginning to come in in small quantities on the market, and sells at 25¢ per lb.
