Millfeed—At \$1.50 to \$1.60 for shorts, and \$1.70 to \$1.80 for bran, west. Barley—Quiet, at 25c to 40c for No. 2 and 3; for No. 3 extra, middle freight. Buck wheat—Steady, at 50c to 55c, middle freight. Corn—Steady, at 25c for Canada yellow west, No. 3 American yellow is quoted at 42c to 44c at Toronto. Oats—Steady, No. 2 white, 25c to 27c, middle freight; No. 3 white, 25c to 27c, middle freight; and 60c north and west. Butter—Firm; pound rolls, 15c to 20c, and large rolls at 15c to 17c, and tubs at 15c to 16c; creamery is steady and unchanged, at 22c to 23c for prints, and 20c to 22c for solids.
