YESTERDAY IN THE LONDON CHURCHES

Bishop of Ontario Preaches at St. James', South London
—Notes.

Rev. William Lennox Mills, Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Ontario, preached to large congregations at both services at St. James' Church, South London, yesterday, having remained over Sunday as the guest of the Dean of Huron. In the morning his lordship spoke eloquently and impressively upon the practical side of the divinity of Christ. He emphasized the fact that the view held by many, whether they realized it or not, that Christ was simply a great and perfect man, was entirely inadequate. He dwelt upon the necessity and the value of the incarnation. Christ showed himself to be a perfect man, but he also showed that he was the eternal God, manifested in human form. Yesterday was set apart for special missionary collections at St. James' Church.

The pulpit in the Church of St. John the Evangelist was occupied yesterday morning by the Rev. Principal Walter of Huron College.

Rev. Mr. Munro, pastor of the Ridgeway Presbyterian Church, will take the pulpit in the New St. James' Church, North London, on Sunday. The Rev. Mr. Munro will conduct the anniversary services to be held in the Ridgeway church on the same occasion.

The First Presbyterian Church will hold its anniversary services next Sunday. The pulpit will be taken in the morning by Rev. W. J. Clark, the pastor, and in the evening by Rev. Dr. Ross. The occasion will be marked by a special effort to lessen the debt on the church.

On next Wednesday evening the first of the annual and regular services of the St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church will be held. With the exception of the board of managers, all the organizations will make their reports for the past year.

Special union services will be held in the Maitland Street Baptist Church this week for all the churches of that denomination in the city.
