DEFINITE WORD OF TROOPS' ARRIVAL

Grampian Carried 18th Battalion Safely to Bristol, England.

NORTHLAND HAD OTHERS

Including Those Hospital Detachments From London and Toronto.

[Canadian Press.]—The news of the arrival at Bristol yesterday of the Grampian and Northland releases the information that these ships sailed from Halifax on April 18, with a number of troops on board, which troops have now reached the other side safely.

The units carried were: On the Grampian—Divisional Engineers, Ottawa, Field Ambulance detachments from Montreal and Toronto; hospital detachments from Toronto and London.

On the Northland—The 18th Battalion, London; headquarters staff divisional train, St. John, and companies of the divisional train from St. John, Montreal, Winnipeg and Vancouver, and field butchery and depot units of supply from Toronto.

BATTLESHIPS SILENCE

smoke and fire were seen on the heights above Seddul Bahr. By three o'clock the Seddul Bahr fort seemed utterly knocked to pieces, and the battleships moved further in, landing posted on all the shore of the river, and the narrow had been definitely battered down. The Turks made little attempt to return the shells.

Splendid Shooting.
"Shortly after six o'clock the Turks provided a diversion at Cape Helles, where the Allies had landed a few days earlier in the morning. A Turkish battery came into sight, moving into position to attack the landing force, but before the Turks could open fire, the batteries of the Allies turned the range at the first shot, burying a battery in a cloud of dust. The second shell burst in the midst of the gunners, and thereafter the Turks fired by their guns and managed to fire three ineffective shots before their successive bombs dropped by ships whistled them out.

British Ship Did Trick.
"A fierce artillery duel took place at seven o'clock between forces which had landed and Turkish forces on the heights beyond Seddul Bahr. A great British battleship came in close to shore to assist the batteries of the landing force and silenced those of the Turks.

"The net result of the operations is that the Allies are in complete possession of the tip of the Gallipoli Peninsula and the flat shores of Suvla Bay, nine miles from the Narrows on the opposite side of the peninsula. Good progress also has been made towards the reduction of the forts in the Narrows."

GALLIOLI TAKEN.

[Canadian Press.]—The following dispatch has been received by the Express from the Athens correspondent: "I learn from Tenedos that the Allies occupied the town of Gallipoli after heavy fighting. Allied forces disembarked at Enos, advanced nearly 20 miles and occupied several villages."

"Three British warships bombarded Turkish positions in the Gulf of Smyrna, and it is stated that allied troops also landed in the neighborhood of Smyrna."

"We points on the line between Enos and Saros were selected by the Allies for the disembarkation of troops. Another force was landed on the Bulair line. A demonstration by a landing party on the plains of Troy led to the capture of the 8,000 prisoners. Turkish troops continue to arrive."

TURKISH VERSIONS.

[Canadian Press.]—Constantinople, April 29.—Via London, 1 p.m.—An official statement issued here today says that the allied forces, which landed on the Asiatic side of the Dardanelles, have been entirely cleared away, that a large part of the troops which invaded Gallipoli Peninsula has been driven off, and that several warships and transports of the Allies have been damaged.

The statement is as follows: "No enemy forces remain on the Asiatic side of the Dardanelles."

Are "Obtinate."

"Hostile forces at Gaba Tepe (west coast) of the Gallipoli Peninsula, near the tip of the peninsula, are obstinately maintaining their positions, under the protection of ships."

"From other parts of Gallipoli the enemy has been driven off. We have damaged several warships and transports."

TURKS REVEY WILL RETURN TO SERE

Rev. H. H. Bingham Returns To London After a Confab With "Paroled" Prisoner in South and Justice Department Officials At Ottawa—Belief in Riley Still Strong As Ever.

"I believe that in the course of a few days Tom Riley will voluntarily give himself up and return to the Kingston Penitentiary," said Rev. H. H. Bingham today on his return from Ottawa, where he had been in communication with members of the department of justice in behalf of Riley, the slayer of Blackburn, who some time ago was released on a pardon meant for Thomas Riley, of Hamilton.

Speaking on his trip to Ottawa, Mr. Bingham stated that as yet he was unable to make a statement as to what he accomplished there, but he was still of opinion that when he communicated with Riley, or probably before he did so, the man who was allowed his freedom by a mistake, would be en route to the prison.

Riley Unaware of Truth.
"I am of the firm belief," said Mr. Bingham, that Riley did not, until a few days ago, know that he had been allowed his freedom through an error. Had he known the true state of affairs I believe that he would not have been back in Kingston by now."

"Riley has not a yellow streak in him, and he is not a quitter." If it had not been for whiskey, and the company he fell in with, he would never have been in trouble, and I believe that he will look at the situation squarely and return," he now stated.

Many Stories Untrue.
"All this stuff about Riley being escorted out of the country by soldiers and his being in hiding I believe is untrue. With a term of fourteen years staring you in the face if you have an usual inclination to hide, you would not be in the same position as Riley," asked Mr. Bingham of a reporter.

"I think I would be on my way to Mexico," replied Riley, "if I had not been in the same position as Riley," concluded Mr. Bingham, "and firmly believe that now he knows the true condition of affairs, he will return. Anyway, I expect to write to him today, and I think that shortly he will return, when the matter will be fixed up definitely."

London, April 30.—The east coast of England again has been subjected to an aerial attack, accompanied by the usual infliction of material damage, but without casualties of any sort. Like former raids, this one of last night, marked by differences of opinion as to the type of air machine used by the Germans, but most people agree that a Zepplin carried the raiders, who arrived in the small hours of the morning, and spent a brief time over Ipswich and Bury St. Edmunds.

Another item of news of striking interest was the presence, reported officially from Paris, of a German fleet off the coast of Belgium and the shell of Dunkirk with the loss of twenty lives. Further news of this marine activity on the part of Germany is awaited anxiously in London.

But the strongest opposition comes from Ireland. Some idea of the strength of this opposition to the proposal of this opposition is indicated by the London correspondent of the Manchester Guardian, a leading Government organ, which declares that the measure proposed by Chancellor of the Exchequer Lloyd George will not pass the House.

Irish quarters still remain reserved concerning the military operations on the Dardanelles, but the London papers this morning contain a number of special dispatches from that region, which the claims are made that the Allies are steadily advancing under cover of the sea, but without without meeting an opposition which is causing them heavy losses.

British troops are reported in occupation of the narrow tongue of the peninsula to the north of the town of Gallipoli. Athens predicts that this campaign will last a long time, as the Turks occupy exceptionally well-prepared defensive positions.

An Irritating Wedge.
The fighting in the western area of hostilities still centres around Steenakete. This position, occupied by the Germans, forms an irritating wedge in the allied line.

In the east there has been some revival of activity along the line in Russian-Poland, where improvement in weather conditions has led the Germans to make a number of isolated attacks. These, however, according to Petrograd advices, have been repulsed.

In the Carpathians and Bukovina preparations evidently are under way for a resumption of operations on a large scale, but as yet there has been no pronounced change in the relative positions of the contending forces in these localities.

WINNIPEG OFFICER SUCUMB TO WOUNDS

Lieut. A. R. Ball Dies at Boulogne—Not London Man.

[Special to The Advertiser.]—Winnipeg, Man., April 29.—Lieut. A. R. Ball, 106th Winnipeg Light Infantry, died of wounds today at Boulogne Hospital, according to a cable received by his father, who is manager of the Eastern Townships Bank here.

It was thought when the casualty was first reported that the man wounded might be Sergt. Trumpler, A. E. Ball, of this city. The above dispatch disposes of this theory.

LONDON GIVE WATER AND LIGHT FREE TO SOLDIERS

Utilities Commission Pledges This For Camp—No Time Limit On Offer.

Free water and light for the militia camp here were pledged by the public utilities commission at its meeting yesterday afternoon. No time limit was set on the offer, it being passed for "the duration of the war."

Commissioner W. W. McFarland, who tomorrow becomes president of the board of trade, informed the other members of the commission that the board of trade had taken upon itself to pledge this concession to hold the camp in London. Chairman Philip Pocock also said that he had assured Mr. H. A. Stevenson before the latter left for Ottawa on Wednesday evening that he would do all in his power to secure it.

There was no question as to the granting of the privilege. Chairman Pocock, however, declared that he thought it hardly right that such a concession should be granted against each other for the camp, and drew attention to the fact that it would be impossible for Guelph to offer free light, as the board of trade had taken upon itself to pledge this concession to hold the camp in London. Chairman Philip Pocock also said that he had assured Mr. H. A. Stevenson before the latter left for Ottawa on Wednesday evening that he would do all in his power to secure it.

"We will do anything that any other city can do," said Commissioner McFarland. "I feel that we must do all we can in our power," said Commissioner Mitchell.

THE LOCAL MARKET

Oats fell in price on the market today, the average stated being \$1.83 to \$1.85 per cwt., a considerable decline since the first of the week. Hay, at prices unchanged for the last few days, the average price being about \$12 per ton.

Pork prices have remained fairly steady, the average being \$12.50 per cwt. dressed hogs selling at \$12.50 per cwt. In the large markets there has been a stiffening in prices. Supplies are not large, and the demands of the packers is said.

Small vegetables have been scarce on the market, being offered only on Saturdays. The few that are offered are as follows: Rhubarb, 25c to 40c a dozen; green onions, 20c to 40c a dozen; parsnips, 15c to 20c a dozen; lettuce, 40c to 50c a dozen; radishes, 15c to 20c a dozen.
