





WILD CATTLE CHARGE STAMPEDED AUSTRIANS

Italians Find New Way of Breaking Through Wire Entangle [Canadian Press.]

Rome, June 4 .- Via Paris, June -Fifty wild cattle materially aided Italian troops in capturing a strong Austrian position on Montecordo, according to the Corriere d'Italia. MORAL EFFECT OF PRZEMYSL CAPTURE ITS WORST FEATURE
