MAKE GERMANY PAY IS FRENCH SLOGAN

Facing Choice Between Ruin and Forfeit, Says Newspaper.

Paris, Dec. 26 .- France has de ermined upon drastic measures to make Germany pay, which will be announced at the resumption of the premiers' conference Jan. 2, it was semi-officially stated today.

The French scheme is being worked out in detail this week. It does not involve immediate military occupation or annexation of the Ruhr Vailey, it has been learned.

Instead, an extraordinary session of the ministerial council recommended a general economic guardianship of the Rhine and Ruhr, with a customs barrier between these valuable

The French would collect customs into Germany and apply such col-lections to the reparations settle-ment. It has been learned that the government will base this policy on three premises:

1.-France must be paid. 2.—Germany apparently does not intend to tap the resources of Ruhr magnates, who are now the principal holders of German wealth.

3.—Germany's 1923 payments are expected to fall far short of what
