

WHAT'S THE LITTLE GAME?

It is impossible at this distance from the scene of action to forecast with any degree of accuracy the true result of the intervention in Roumania; but one can see at a glance that it is not—or at least ought not to be—the intervention of Germany and Austria to have the Balkans, which form the natural barrier to Russia's ambitious designs on the Danubian plain, removed politically and an avenue opened for the march of the czar's legions on Constantinople, the first opportunity. The growth of Roumanian power means the building of an empire so vast that in less than a century it will be strong enough to dominate Europe and thus verify the dream of Constantine the Great. The latest dispatches indicate that Russia is not a party to the return of Roumania to the Bulgarians.
