





Fulton was recently appointed organizer for this district. At a recent meeting of those interested after the objects of the labor congress had been fully explained and a number of those present had given their views as to what a labor union should endeavor to secure, the local branch of the Trades, and Labor Congress was formed. It was decided to name the new union the "Grand Forks Smeltermen's Federal Union of the Dominion Labor Congress." The new organization will be of a non-political character.
