Official Reply to the British Government's Enquiry in the Matter.

London, July 18.-Under Colonial Secetary Churchill imparted to the house of commons this afternoon the official reply to the government's inquiries into the alleged atrocities perpetrated on the the alleged atrocties perpetrated on the wounded Zulus in Natal during the operations against the rebel chief Bambaata. According to a telegram from the governor of Natal, three thousand natives were killed throughout the operations and 2,000 were made prisoners, including the wounded. The Natal government had no information of wounded natives being killed by the native levies.

The telegram confirmed the official version of Bataatas' head being cut off for
