GASPE HARBOR THE SCENE OF MUCH ACTIVITY DURING SUMMER

Shipments of Sulphate Pulp Estimated To Exceed Half Million Dollar Mark—Large Quantities Of Coal Imported

The harbor at Gaspé has been the scene of considerable activity during the summer. The numerous smaller vessels engaged in the coastwise trade of one kind or another, some thirteen sea-going ships have docked at this famous natural harbour and discharged and loaded cargoes from and for foreign ports. The shipping season is not yet over but the imports and exports of this port for the five months from May to September inclusive already run into large figures.

It is estimated that coal to the value of nearly \$500,000 has been unloaded at Gaspé during the season. Besides this, large cargoes of salt and sulphur have also been discharged by foreign vessels. Approximately 13,000 tons of sulphate pulp have been shipped during the season and it is estimated that the combined value of these shipments exceed the half million dollar mark. In addition to this large quantities of rosin and pitch have also been exported for the American market. The combined tonnage of the visiting vessels is placed at 27,190 tons.

Following is a list of the ships entered, giving name, tonnage, nationality and cargo: Str. Neils R. Finson, 1,100 tons, Danish, 1,100 tons, loaded with 2,700 tons sulphate pulp; Str. Philip T. Dodge, British, 3,681 tons, entered light, took cargo of 3,400 tons of rosin; Str. Christian Krogh, Norwegian, 1,134 tons, discharged 2,600 tons of coal; Str. Warshaw, British, 1,021 tons, entered light of 2,500 tons sulphate pulp; Str. St. John, 1,134 tons, discharged 2,373 tons coal and took on cargo of 2,500 tons sulphate pulp; Str. Olga, Selmer, German, 1,977 tons, discharged cargo of 2,100 tons coal from Newcastle, England and sailed light for another Gaspé coast port; Str. Gyp, British, 2,116 tons, entered light and took on cargo of 5,000 tons sulphate pulp; Str. Aldian, German, 2,187 tons, discharged 6,240 tons coal and sailed light for another Gaspé coast port. The Str. Jakob Mathias, 1,348 tons, sailed on a cargo of salt from Gaspé, Spain and sailed light; Str. Gyp on second trip brought 4,851 tons of coal from Newcastle, England and sailed light for another Gaspé coast port.

There has also been considerable activity in shipping along the whole Gaspé Peninsula during the past summer, several ships having loaded at New Carlisle, Paspébec and Port Daniel. Reports from these other districts have not yet been received.
