The drill shed difficulties are not ended yet. The Dominion authorities are desirous of closing up Centre-street along the line of the expropriation, but opposition is expected from the property-owners on that thorough-fare north of the site. The city offers to com-pensate for the closing up of the south end of Centre-street by opening up one running east to Chestnut-street and west to University-street just north of the site. The Property Committee met yesterday to discuss the situation. Ald Moses presided, there were present Ald Vokes, Small, Leslie, Saunders, Ritchie, Maughan, City Surveyor Sankey, Alssistant City Solicitor Caswell. The new street would be 30 feet wide and the land to make it would be 30 feet wide and the land site. If Centre-street is not closed the site is almost useless for the purposes intended, and if it is closed the northern property-owners in Centre-street will demand damages.
