John J. Dixon & Co. received the following despatch over their private wire from Schwartz, Dupee & McCormack:

CHICAGO, Aug. 28.—It proved a dull day in wheat, prices early advancing over a cent. The visible supply was unexpectedly favorable, showing a decrease of 572.000 bushels against an increase last year of 3,175,000 bushels. The Hungarian report on the world's crop was variously taken. It indicated a better yield than last year, nevertheless it was pronounced simply a crop up to the average of the last ten years. That gave rise though to the argument that an average crop should lead to average prices. There was a lot of changing at 61/60 differences. Cables were higher. The London Times said that Great Britain would need to import \$24 million bushels. Export clearances were lighter than they have been running. Primary market receipts begin to show some increase. The vote on the silver bill probably gave some bull encouragement.

Corn was strong early because the temperatures in the Northwest were in the thrities, and because there was the fear that frost would get down in the corn belt. Prices advanced fractionally. The signal service predictions for Tues-ady indicate no frost except for Wisconsjin. The estimated car loads for Tuesday were very large, 1175 cars. The morning inspection was 754 cars. The trade was not large. The visible supply decreased 21,000 bushels. Crop reports from the west of river continue very grod. Portions of Illinois continue very dry. Large

bushels increased 73,000 bushels. Crop reports from the west of river continue very good. Portions of Illinois continue very dry. Large receipts made oats weak. Prices followed closely after corn. There was an advance early, a sharp break towards the close. The visible supply increased 647,000 bushels.

Provisions opened lower under large receipts of hogs, but were sharply advanced during the last hour by the long interest, which has full control of the market.






