REPORTS TO PROVE THE HOLMES SERVICE UNRELIABLE.

Ex-Watchman Sprott Recalled - Former Employee of the Protection Company in the Witness Box - The Simpson Fire Inquest will be held on Tuesday.

CARETAKER REES DISCHARGED

Special Meeting of the Public School Board Last Night Decided on Dismissing Him With His Services.

As finally adopted by the Public School Board at their meeting last evening the caretaker for 1895 was at \$474.15.50. Of this amount \$33,043 is for salaries.

Some discussion arose as to increases in the salaries of officials which were recommended. The full amount of \$15,876 was placed in the estimates, however, the report being referred back, with instructions to equalize the salaries.

Following are the salaries to be recommended: Senior inspector \$3000, junior inspector \$2500, secretary-treasurer \$2250, superintendent of buildings \$2500, solicitor \$1200, drill instructor \$1200, bookkeeper in secretary-treasurer's office \$800, inspectors' assistant, Mr. W. Kerr, \$600, inspectors' assistant, Miss S. E. Edwards, \$400; clerk of supplies \$800; assistance in superintendent of buildings' office \$950; assistance in secretary-treasurer's office \$800.

An increase of \$100 was made in the salary of the drill instructor, after slight objection.

An item of \$6000 for a playground at McCaul-street School was struck out of the estimate, the amount being used for the cost of additional accommodation at \$61,500. A sum of \$54,000 has been struck from the original estimate.

Dr. Hunter expressed the hope that the City Council would not grant one cent for additional accommodation, as the accommodation asked for was less necessary than that projected.

The sum of \$2700 was deducted from the Supply report, so that the cost of supplies will be \$47,050. Rees was then brought up by a unanimous order of the board that the official.
