**Household Hints.**

**PUDGING SAUCE.**—Put two cups of powdered sugar, one egg, and half a cup of butter into a cake bowl and beat until like ice-cream. If you have a Keystone egg-beater, this can be made in three minutes.

**CHEESE STICKS.**—Make a rich pie paste; roll it out very thin, grate over the English cheese, and sprinkle tiny bits of cayenne over; fold over the paste and roll out again, and put on more cheese as before; when there is enough, and the paste is folded over and rolled out thin, cut it in strips half an inch in width and two fingers in length. Bake to a light brown. Serve hot or cold. They must be crisp.

**MINCE MEAT.**—Nine pounds meat, fourteen pounds apples, two pounds suet, four pounds raisins and the same of currants, nine lemons, one-half gallon of molasses, five pounds brown sugar, three cups vinegar, four quarts cider, and one quart hot water in which the meat has been cooked. Season with two ounces ground cinnamon, one large tablespoon of cloves, two teaspoons pepper, four nutmegs and a small tablespoon salt. Mix well, heat and can what is not needed for present use. This will make six gallons of most excellent mince meat.

**SALAD.**—One-half cabbage, one pint vinegar, piece of butter half the size of an egg, yolk of an egg, two tablespoons flour and one-half cup sugar. Shave the cabbage as finely as possible. Beat together egg, flour and butter with enough vinegar to make it smooth. Pour into the boiling vinegar and add the sugar. When cooked pour over the cabbage and set away in a covered dish until wanted.

**Broiled Salt Mackerel.**—For twenty-four hours soak the fish in milk and water, then in clear water for an hour or two. Drain, and place the fish on a hot gridiron that has been well greased with pork fat, flesh side down, when brown turn, and butter as soon as cooked. Keep it hot until served.

**STOCK FOR SOUPS.**—Put lean beef into a soup-kettle, about a pound of beef to a quart of water, and place the kettle over the fire. When the contents boil, add a cup of cold water. Remove the scum. Place the kettle then over a moderate fire, and let the stock simmer slowly for four or five hours. This will make a stock for any meat soup.

**GINGER SNAPS.**—One cup of New Orleans molasses, one-half cup of butter, one-half cup lard, one cup sugar and two teaspoons ginger. Boil together five minutes and when lukewarm stir in enough flower to make a soft dough. Roll thin, cut out and bake.

**TO WASH A FLANNEL SHIRT.**—A clothier states that the proper way to wash a flannel shirt to toouse the garment in soft soap water, never rubbing it, and put it repeatedly through a wringer. The garment should never be wrung with the hands and never put in cold water.

**MACARONI WITH CHICKEN.**—Cook the macaroni tender in broth, and take twice its weight in minced chicken, adding two well-beaten eggs, three spoonfuls of butter, cayenne pepper and salt to taste. Mix the ingredients well, put them in a deep dish and bake until a light brown crust is formed upon the top.


