Finance and Commerce

Weekly Review of Trade-Wholesale Prices

The wholesale trade of our city still remains very quiet, the volume of business being small in amount. The dry goods department has seen few buyers in the market, and iron and hardware has been extremely dull. Leather and its manufacture continue quiet, whilst drugs and chemicals show no great activity. Comparatively little has been done in groceries, and this may apply also to the other remaining branches of trade. The money market during the week was quiet and easy. Good mercantile paper was discounted by the banks at 7 to 8 per cent. Loans on collateral were made at 6 to 7 per cent on call, and 7 to 8 per cent on time. Sterling Exchange was firm at 109 1/2 to 109 3/4 for round amounts of 60 day bills, between banks, and 109 1/4 for counter sales. Drafts on New York were steady at 1-16 to 1/8 per cent premium. Stock speculation has been dull, but showed more strength towards the close of our week. The present condition of Canadian stocks compared with that of a week ago, may be seen from the following comparative statement:-

Last year two million hogs were slaughtered in Germany. In London, City of Toronto 6 per cent debentures are at 110 to 111. The Quebec revenue for March was 100 per cent less than last year. The number of employees on the railways in Massachusetts in 1878 was 19,943. The receipts of the Toronto and North Revenue Department in March were \$299,185. Glass in close imitation of marble is now made in a factory in Hanover.

A number of stone boats are already plying between Toronto and other ports on Lake Ontario. These are a less number of wooden mills in the United States than in operation in last year. A consignment of wagons has been shipped to Montreal by Messrs. Plummer & Son, of London, Ont. Eighteen locomotives are being built by the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railway at its Chicago shops. A sufficient inducement be offered, the Hamilton Rock Company propose opening a factory near Montreal. Great Britain imported 1,228,210 bales of wool last year, being a decrease of 40,000 on the preceding year. An American coal is in great demand at Rome. A shipment of 100,000 tons now being made from the United States. The Quebec merchants, so far, have not received one quarter the number of charters they got this time last year. A large factory has been started at Brookfield, Conn., for the manufacture of corsets, and is to employ 250 hands. The stock of ashes in store in Montreal on April 1st, 1879, were 1,573 barrels; pearls, 182 bags; kelp, 7,437 bushels; and 400 tons of lime. It is stated that the Dominion Government has concluded to remove the duties on herrings imported from Newfoundland. The total bonded debt of New York City on February 24, 1879, was \$14,226,178.91, and on March 31st it was \$15,129,947.91. During the present season no less than 2,500,000 tons of ice have been cut from the Hudson by the 14,000 men and 900 horses. The Hallowell Cotton Company, of Maine, is putting in thirteen new frames, making a total of 200 in the mill. Fifteen thousand bushels of oats have been ground into oatmeal at the Cambry Mill, in Victoria county, during the season. A new bill introduced in the United States Senate, for the purpose of compelling the manufacture of fire insurance companies to furnish life saving appliances. The public debt of Newfoundland is \$1,156,333, of which \$119,250 is repayable before 1882. The estimated revenue for 1879 is \$912,951.21. The St. Clair and Chennel Carts are open to navigation, and are to be used in the line of steamers have made their first trip. The Great Western Railway traffic receipts in March were \$70,533.27; a decrease of \$9,942.25, compared with the same month last year. The cost of the proposed canal across the Isthmus of Darien is \$10,000,000, but the actual cost may be double that of the estimate. The commerce of the United States with Great Britain and her colonies consisted last year of 18 per cent of the entire commerce of the United States. The Georgian Bay Transportation Company is to have weekly trips to Thunder Bay, and a daily service between Collingwood and Parry Sound. A regular line of steamers has been established to ply between New Orleans and Liverpool for the transportation of American cattle to England. The receipts of the Inland Revenue Department of Montreal for the month ending March 31st, 1879, were \$73,701.30, against \$80,257.67 during March, 1878. It is calculated that 210,000 tons of lumber have been cut in the Upper Mississippi, and at points tributary to Minneapolis, during the present season. Whittier's forty-two street lamps cost three hundred and fifty-two dollars to erect, and four hundred and forty-four dollars last year for oil and lighting. The Dundas Screw Company, of Dundas, Ont., are now under the new tariff, to compensate for the increase of all kinds of wire, in relation to screws. The stocks of grain in store in Chicago are: Wheat, 7,409,420 bushels; corn, 2,916,511 bushels; oats, 501,251 bushels; rye, 269,103 bushels; barley, 391,605 bushels. The receipts of grain at Montreal during the past year are as follows:—18,207,000 bushels in 1876; 13,428,000 bushels in 1877, and 12,353,000 bushels in 1878. The Canada Southern Railway evidently does not believe in encouraging home manufactures, having ordered 600 new freight cars from the Harrisburg (Pa.) shops. The land sales of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, during 1878, aggregated 318,000 acres, equivalent to nearly 1000 farms of 320 acres each, at an average of \$484 per acre. Chicago packers have slaughtered 2,721,261 hogs since the beginning of the regular packing season (from November 1, 1878, to date), against 2,874,800 during the same period last year. Chicago had 248 printing offices, 291 bookstores, and 181 binderies. The value of books published in 1877 was \$7,000,000. Leipzig also does a vast business in furs. The estimated number of hogs in the United Kingdom for the next four years is as follows:—3,752,688 hogs in 1878; 3,977,722 in 1877; 3,717,763 in 1879; and 3,419,153 in 1875. Mr. Crossen, of Colbourg, maker of flat and box rolling cars, is now manufacturing passenger cars. Additional buildings are being constructed for that purpose.
