“That the Bill be not now read the third time, but that it be resolved that this House, while approving of the abolition of the office of Receiver-General as a step in the direction of retrenchment, is of opinion that the creation of an additional office in the Department of Justice entails upon the country an unnecessary charge and expense, not justifiable by the requirements of the Public Service, and, therefore, that this Bill be referred back to a Committee of the Whole, with instructions that they have power to strike out all clauses relating to the Department of Justice.”—(<i>Mr. Mitchell</i>).
