I am opposed to the continuation of both the sales tax and the customs tariff, in so far as they impose a tax especially on the necessities of life. Without any long discussion, as my hon. friends seem worried about it, let me say that I think every argument advanced by the hon. leader of the opposition is a valid argument also in respect of the customs tariff, and in that case I feel satisfied he will support me when I move the following amendment:

That all the words after "that" be struck out and the following substituted therefor:

In the opinion of this House the application of the customs tariff in respect of personal clothing and boots and shoes places a heavy and unnecessary burden upon the people of Canada and should be discontinued.

I am delighted to note the premature approval of my amendment by some of my hon. friends to my right, but I feel satisfied, Mr. Speaker, that if they stop interrupting long enough to get the line of argument they will support the amendment as we intend to do.
