On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Aikins it was

Ordered, That the Honorable Messieurs Aikins, Bureau, Burnham, Carrall, Chapais Cochrane, Dumouchel, Ferrier, Locke, McLelan (Londonderry), Muirhead, Oliver, Reeson Simpson and Skead, be appointed a Committee to superintend the printing of this Hous during the present Session.

The Honorable Mr. McMaster presented to the House a list of the Shareholders of Canadian Bank of Commerce, on the sixth day of March, 1873.
