

members of the committee were considered next, and approved; some, however, had already been adopted. Mr. Osborne suggested the use of examinations not on prescribed texts, which is already current in Great Britain.

The chairman's Financial Budget for 1925 and his report on Estimates for 1926, were approved.

Mr. Kerr expressed the committee's sense of indebtedness to the chairman for his management of the investigation and his conduct of the meetings, and to the members of the American Committee for their presence and valued counsel, in a motion seconded by Mr. Osborne, and carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 3.30 p.m.
