time it must be remembered that the Domestic Field may rightly be regarded as a Foreign Field, inasmuch as it is entirely outside our own "Domus" or Diocese, and it certainly has paramount claims upon our attention. The Committee therefore trust that, in response to this year's Ascensiontide appeal, there will be a very large increase in contributions towards the Domestic Fund of the Missionary Board. It is desirable of course that as much special assistance as possible should continue to be offered to Algoma, especially since its Bishop has been chosen from, and is so highly esteemed, in this Diocese; but, beyond this, our prayers should ever be going up before God for His blessing on the work that is being done throughout the Domestic and Foreign Fields, and our alms should be more and more concentrated upon the Domestic Field.

The Committee have again the pleasure of drawing attention to the Report of the Woman's Auxiliary of their work for the year ending May 20th 1897.
