

national, political, or religious discussions, or otherwise conduct himself improperly, such offending brother, after having been thrice duly admonished from the chair, shall be subject to such censure or penalty as a majority of the Brethren then present shall think proper to inflict; to which, if he refuses to submit, he shall be excluded from the Lodge, till he acknowledges his faults and makes submission, and the cause of exclusion reported to the proper Masonic Authorities.

XXV.

DISCUSSION.

When any business shall be brought before the Lodge for discussion, every brother desirous of speaking shall, when he rises, address himself to the W. M.; and no brother shall be permitted to speak more than twice on the same subject, unless called upon by the Master, or as the mover, in reply.

XXVI.

MOTIONS, &c.

No Motion shall be entertained, unless it be made in writing, and signed by the Mover and duly seconded; and no new business shall be entered upon after ten o'clock at night.
