5. Every such Commissioner of Police shall keep minutes of every proceeding had by and before him, and shall keep such accounts, make such returns and collect such information within his jurisdiction, and perform such other duties as the Governor may from time to time prescribe and require.

Every Commissioner of Police and every Police Constable appointed under this Act shall be subject to such regulations in respect to the order, management, and disposition of the Police, and shall receive such rates of pay or allowance as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor in Council; and an account shall be laid before Par- 10 liament within the first two weeks after the meeting of each Session, of the average number of men employed during each month of the year, and of the cost of pay, and of travelling expenses expended in respect thereof.
