PLOT IS REVEALED

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., July 16.—The machinists of Bridgeport, by a unanimous vote tonight voted for a general strike, should the Remington Arms Company decline to meet their demands.

According to the decision, the executive committee was empowered to submit to the Remington Company, first, the proposition that the striking millwrights be taken back to work with cards of metal trades unions.

RAILWAY WILLING TO TALK BUSINESS

Conferece Between Deer Park Representatives and Metropolitan Officials.

TO ASK FOR MEETING

Facts Gathered Will Be Submitted to Board of Control.

That the Metropolitan Railway Company willing to negotiate with the City of Toronto for the sale of that portion of the line between Farnham avenue and the York Mills hill in return for certain concessions, that they are willing to divert the freight traffic from Yonge street, and that Mayor Church misstated the facts of the case in referring to the negotiations between the city and the company.

The conference was held in the office of W. H. Moore, general manager of the Metropolitan railway, and was attended by officials of the railway and J. M. Shelton, W. J. Fenell, E. J. Hathaway and W. Cook representing the Deer Park Ratepayers' Association.

Open to Negotiate. The meeting was of a semi-private nature, but from representations made by the Deer Park men it was learned that the company are open to negotiate for the sale of the line within the city limits conditional upon the city granting running rights for the C.P.R. tracks.

It is also pointed out that traffic on upper Yonge street is increasing enormously, that Avenue road is practically prohibitive for heavy loads, and that there is no thru road on the east between Yonge and Tordomden.

The difficulty, it is said will be met in the substitution of a section of Yonge street instead of the thru widening and will necessitate the passing of a new by-law. This, however, is not regarded as insurmountable. The portion of Yonge street south of and including the church is to be dealt with at a later date.

WIDEN YONGE ST. NORTH OF TRACK

Present Regarded as Opportunity Time to Commence Improvement.

SCHEME IS FEASIBLE

Business Men and Others Are in Accord With Proposed Change.

Acting on the general assumption that the widening of Yonge street north of the C.P.R. tracks has been definitely accepted by the city council as one of the works to be undertaken as soon as the financial horizon clears away a big movement is now on foot in the northern part of the city to begin initial work at once.

At the last meeting of the city council the approximate cost of \$200,000 was voted to reduce the grade immediately north of the C.P.R. tracks on upper Yonge street.

In view of this and the added fact that the Metropolitan tracks have been torn up south of Farnham avenue the time is regarded as most opportune for widening that part of Yonge street just north of the Yonge Street Methodist Church to Jackes of Rose Hill avenue.

It is also pointed out that traffic on upper Yonge street is increasing enormously, that Avenue road is practically prohibitive for heavy loads, and that there is no thru road on the east between Yonge and Tordomden.

The difficulty, it is said will be met in the substitution of a section of Yonge street instead of the thru widening and will necessitate the passing of a new by-law.
