the just presentiments, the precious foretastes of the happiness that is to follow from the great, effential, and decifive fervices that are to be rendered to the Public.

In the political fcale of juffice and fuccefs, I am furely a man more finned against than finning; yet I conjure all to follow the example I mean to fet. I intreat and implore All to facrifice even their juftest refentm ats to the Love of their Country. In this great principle let all meaner passions be abforbed and lost. Let us join, all of us, heart and hand to establish on a folid and permanent basis the Solvency of the State. Without Refources for Offence, without Refources for Defence; without Incomes adequate, or any thing near to adequate to even a Peace-Establishment; Constitution, Liberty, even Property itfelf, are but empty names. We are a Blank amongst the Nations of the Earth; we cease to be a People,
