Paris, May 12.—The Chamber of Deputies to-day approved the Anglo-French Niger-Nile convention. This agreement between Great Britain and France disposes of hundreds of thousands of square miles of African territory and leaves only four recognied independent states throughout the continent—Morocco, Abyssinia, Liberia and the Orange Free State. HARVEY TALKS COOLLY. he Michigan Murderer Sorry He Killed His Wife-Expected to Kill Himself.

Howard City, Mich., May 12.—Joseph Harvey, murderer of his grandmother, uncle and wife, who also fatally wounded his father-in-law and tried to commit suicide, was taken to the county jail at Stanton to-day, after being arraigned before a justice of the peace. He waived examination and was held for trial. The young man expressed no emotion over his atrocious crimes. He has given no evidence whatever of insanity, saying only that Pearson, his uncle, abused him and quartelled with him because he had been driving Pearson's horse in the rain. He still insist that his dead uncle killed his grandnother, and that he killed his uncle out of revenge. He says he is sorry he-killed is wife, but did it because he intended o kill himself and did not want her to twe after he was gone. Aside from having a flery temper, Harvey was not known o have any vicious traits.

A Fearful Explosion. London, May 12.—A fearful explosion occurred to day at Kurtz's Chemical Works. St. Helens, Lancashire County, killing 4 persons and seriously injuring 20. Fire broke out in the chlorate house and a large quantity of chlorate exploded, causing much destruction. Subsequently the boiler exploded and the whole works were razed. The town was strewn with debris and most of the buildings in the place were damaged. The total loss was about \$500,000.

Dr. Whisitt Accused of Heresy.
Louisville, Ky., May 12.—The Board of Trustees of the Baptist Theological Seminary, after being in session until 11 o'clock last night, accepted the resignation of Dr. W. H. Whitsitt as president of the seminary. The vote was 22 to 20. President Whitsitt was a professor in the seminary, when, in making researches in the British museum, he found what he considered proof that the Baptists in England did not immerse previous to 1041, and was accused of heresy.


