Guelph, Sept. 7.—Private Sam Barber, just returned from Africa, was warmly greeted on his arrival last evening. The crowd unthrottled the horse and dragged the carriage themselves. Afterwards both were started, contrary to by-law, and the police took a stand. One boy was arrested, and the crowd rescued him, the policeman being roughly handled. Later another arrest was made, and the prisoner was landed in the cells. The mob started to release him, and the windows of the Police Station were broken against young men who were released on an order from Mayor Nelson, who was surrounded by a mob. For a time it looked like a riot, but cooler counsels prevailed, and a number of young men were detained against young men who will be brought to court. The reception was quite unbecoming. WAR AMONG THE RANGERS. Cattle Men Drove Sheep Over a Precipice and Killed Them and Their Drivers.
