EARL IS A ROYAL DEPUTY CHIEF JUSTICE HERE ONLY

Senator Miller Points Out the More Solemn Indignities of Sir Ezelex's Attitude.

Ottawa, May 17.—(Special.)—Sir Ezelex's attitude is not yet out of the woods so far as his trouble with the senators is concerned. In the senate today Hon. Mr. Miller called attention to what he termed the 'unseemly proceedings' of the deputy governor.

As chief justice he could claim no higher position than the speaker of the house. He absolved the present distinguished governor-general from any blame, but he thought the principle of giving assent by deputy governor was beneath the dignity of the act. He said he was not sure if the deputy governor was an able lawyer, frequently coming down and sitting in the speaker's chair, when he was speaking, he would not allow his chair to be occupied by a deputy.

Dr. Bruce Smith Finds These Institutions Deserving. The report of Dr. Bruce Smith, inspector of hospitals, was presented to the legislature yesterday. Dr. Smith scores city hospitals in this way: In some of the city hospitals I have found lamentable conditions of the absolute necessities necessary to promote hygienic conditions. Patients, especially children, are crowded together in ill-ventilated wards.
