On Saturday, 24th June, the School enjoyed a picnic in the grove at Chelsea, kindly placed at our disposal by Messrs. Gilmour & Hughson.

The Annual Festival was held on Friday evening, 9th February, and proved as entertaining and popular as ever to the scholars and their friends. The Infant Class presented Miss McDonald with a watch, on the occasion of her retiring from the class, which she had conducted for ten years.

Mr. Jenkins, Organist of the Church, has kindly organized and taught a Choral Class in connection with the Sunday School, numbering about 40 members. The class has made good progress, and contributed to the enjoyment of our special services.

We rejoice to see a number of our scholars professing their faith in Christ by joining the membership of the Church, and we look forward with hope and joy to the work of another year, forasmuch as we know that "our labour is not in vain in the Lord."

The Sunday collections during the year amounted to \$207.89, which sum has been allocated to Missionary and Benevolent Schemes, as per subjoined statement:—
