The journeymen barbers' schedule for higher wages and shorter hours is to become effective Monday, that is if the master barbers are agreeable to its terms. At present, it is stated, there is every indication that they will grant the increased demands and to offset this additional expense there is a possibility that rates for hair shaves, etc., will take a still further jump.

The journeymen barbers met last night and several new members were accepted. The schedule presented by the union a week with half of all takings over \$220, many favored a flat rate of \$15 or \$16 a week. Another meeting will be called before the new conditions become operative and it is possible that the flat rate clause will be substituted.

EX-JUDGE CHARLTON DIES IN PORTO RICO

Father of Porter Charlton, Who Killed His Wife in Italy, Succumbed to an Operation

San Juan, Porto Rico, June 7.—Paul Charlton, former United States district judge for Porto Rico, died this week at Juan Diaz, following an operation for carbuncle. He was the father of Porter Charlton, who in 1910 killed his wife in a villa on Lake Como, Italy, where he was on their honeymoon, and who was released from prison in 1915 and returned to the United States.

Paul Charlton was born in Harrisburg, Penn., in 1856. He was graduated from Yale in 1878 and was admitted to the bar in 1882. After practicing in Harrisburg and Omaha, Neb., he became attached to the bureau of insular affairs of the war department and later became United States district judge for Porto Rico, which post he held until 1912, when he resumed the practice of law at San Juan.

While flying over Doncaster district the machine of Lieut. A. E. Venables, R. F. C., caught fire. The unfortunate officer managed to alight, but was burned to death.

The King has appointed Major General Sir George John Younghusband to be Keeper of the Jewel House, Tower of London, in room of General Sir Arthur Singleton Wynne, resigned.
