Admiralty Reveals Britain's Growing Might at Sea

(Weekly Scotsman.)

For the first time since the war began the Admiralty has revealed the growing strength of the senior service. The announcement in the shipyards is fully described by Reuters's special correspondent as follows:—

By the courtesy of the Admiralty I was permitted to visit a number of munition centres and shipbuilding areas and naval bases in the United Kingdom. What I witnessed was a revelation even to those who realised that "Britain Prepared" was something more than a mere phrase.

First was visited a famous shipbuilding centre—only one characteristic of many others in the British Isles. Not only were all the stocks on both banks occupied with vessels ranging from patrol boats to battle cruisers, but wherever space permitted new stocks had been erected, until whole sections of the waterway were lined with vessels of varying size, some only showing their giant ribs, while others were ready to take the water. But a few feet of space were between each vessel. Here and there one placed upon the water, and there one in the process of construction—enormous speed ranged in lines of half a score, submarines—completed or under construction—in series, vessels of mysterious build with their hulls hidden by canvas screens, great Atlantic liners, patrol boats, and other smaller craft in scores and mammoth warships of dimensions, speed, and gun power that must not even be hinted at. Not only are these vessels being finished in numbers hitherto unheard of, but they are proceeding at a rate of construction some where about double that ever regarded as possible in the past.

There in the middle of the waterway—greatest sight of all—with the water lapping her sides, was the mammoth

Warship, which the Germans claim to have sunk in the Jutland battle, not a whit the worse for the damage she sustained, and ready for sea at any moment. As showing the remarkable speeding up of work, which has taken place in all directions, it may be permissible here to say that within a couple of hours of her arrival the damaged Warship was safely in dry dock and her bottom plates being examined in a great graving dock that was not due to be completed until this time next year.

While aboard one of the great battleships which had been in the Jutland fight, I showed to the admiral the semi-official German account of the fight. The assertions made caused much amusement among the officers. The Admiral read the account carefully, and said:—

"The whole version is nonsense. As to the German allegation that the British fleet lost contact with itself. We have seen ships, which ships have either been sunk or hopelessly damaged, according to the enemy, and have seen that one and all are now and have been for some time repaired to the smallest particular and ready for sea. But apart from this, the fact is that many of the vessels sustained damage of such non-vital character that there was nothing to prevent them going sea weeks ago. Now it seems that the Germans declare that their fleet was the aggressor from the beginning to the end. To this I would only ask why, if they were the aggressors, did they turn away, and why did they throw out smoke screens, to conceal their retreat? That does not somehow look like an aggressor."

feet had appeared on the scene. This is too ridiculous. They gleamed away as soon as we appeared. One ship I fired on and she disappeared for all she was worth. The others did the same. Next the Germans after that the British fleet lost contact with itself. We never lost contact at all. I suppose they can only mean that certain parts of the fleet may have been engaged on some particular piece of work of its own. Then we come to the new claims as to our losses—and here I note that the Germans have ceased to talk about the loss of the Warship, which is, perhaps, as well in view of the fact that you have seen the Warship yourself. They still assert that the British lost one Dreadnought of the Queen Elizabeth class. It is wholly untrue, as is also the assertion that we have lost a vessel of the Cressy class, two small cruisers, and thirteen destroyers. We have lost no ships of the Cressy class, no small cruisers, and it has already been stated that we lost nine destroyers. This is not thirteen. They know quite well what would have happened if they had not steamed off the other day. The evidence of the disorganisation that had set in among them were clear."

NEW PASTOR PREACHES IN GERMAIN STREET CHURCH

Rev. S. S. Poole began his pastorate in Germain Street Baptist church on Sunday. He is a fluent and scholarly speaker, and his sermons morning and evening were greatly appreciated by the congregation. There was a very large attendance at the evening service, and an exceptionally good programme of music was rendered. There were solos by Miss Fenton and Miss Folsom, a violin solo by Miss Folsom and a vocal solo by Mr. Moffat, with organ and violin accompaniment.

Another quotation, from Lanier's Marches of Glyn, illustrated Mr. Poole's plea for an absolute trust in God.

As the marsh-hen secretly builds on the watery sod, Behold I will build me a nest in the greatness of God; I will fly in the greatness of God as the marsh-hen flies.

In the freedom that fills all the space 'twixt the marsh and the skies; By so many roots as the marsh-grass sends in the sod I will hoistly lay me a-hold on the greatness of God.

The preacher said that God might not care for us in the exact way we desire, but if we grasp the thought that

we may be in harmony with the power and the wisdom and the love that are behind the universe, our lives will assume a new aspect. The guide of the Hebrew pilgrim may be ours, in all the pilgrimages of life.

FINDS SON BY NEWSPAPER

Mother Recognizes Picture of Soldier Missing Eight Years.

Petersburg, N. J., Sept. 4.—Mrs. Fred Tiers, of 148 Atlantic street, was throwing away some old newspapers several weeks ago when a picture of a group of soldiers on the Mexican border attracted her attention. One of the soldiers looked like her son, Fred Tiers, who disappeared four years ago, who disappeared from home eight years ago.

The mother got in touch with Congressman Dow H. Decker, who in turn communicated with the military authorities, with the result that Mrs. Tiers has received word that her long-lost son is enlisted in the army at Fort George Wright in August, 1911, and was at the present time a member of Troop C, Thirtieth Cavalry.
