Armistice Day Observance in King Square Wednesday Morning

Post Office Scene of Earlier Remembrance of Soldier Dead

This year, for the first time, there will be a commemorative service in front of the civic war memorial in King square.

Armistice Day, tomorrow, is to be fittingly observed in Saint John when on the request of Acting-Mayor J. H.

Frink there will be a two minutes' silence period arranged, a fire alarm signal being blown to mark the commencement of the period at 11 o'clock and its close at 11.02 a.m.

This year, for the first time, there will be a commemorative service in front of the civic war memorial in King square.

As tomorrow will be the first anniversary of Armistice Day since the erection of the memorial, the Municipal chapter of the I. O. D.
