Comment on Some Phases in St. John

At the council meeting of the Society for Prevention of Cruelty this afternoon, D. Carleton Clench, president, presented the following report:

"This, the fortieth annual report of your society, is the first that I have had the honor of making since I came into office, and I find little to report. I am happy to say that the number of cases of cruelty to horses reported to the society has been fewer this last year than usual. The general use of motor trucks has reduced the number of horses used for draft purposes, and the taxicab has taken the place of the horse drawn coach to a great extent. I find from daily observation that horses of the above classes in the city today are, with few

exceptions, in good condition and well treated, although a word of caution applied to the driver is necessary now and then. I have much pleasure in testifying to the excellent work done by the ladies of the Animal Rescue League, and regret very much that they are badly hampered by lack of funds.

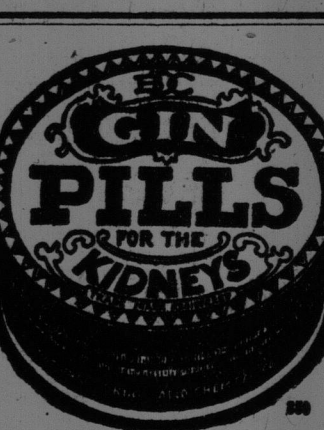

Work of the Year.

S. M. Wetmore, secretary and agent, reported that a smaller number of cases were dealt with than in previous years. This, he hoped, may be due to the influence of the society, and that people are getting more readily convinced as to the rights of the dumb animals, but as there are always exceptions, it will require perseverance in the work.

"I am pleased to say," he continues, "that with the valuable advice and assistance given me throughout the year past by our president, D. C. Clench, many minor acts of cruelty in the city and other parts of the province have been investigated and dealt with out of court. As I have previously stated, many of the minor acts of cruelty are done thoughtlessly or through habit, and when their attention is drawn to it they will, in almost every case, admit their fault, and promise to be more careful in the future, but as we well know, many good resolutions are often broken, and we have to keep following them up."

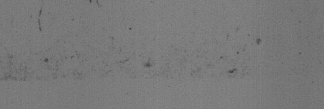

mean by this is that quite often persons will call upon me by phone and say they just saw a horse or some other animal being very cruelly ill-treated, but they were not sure how to prevent it. Now I feel safe in saying that in almost every instance like that, if they would only speak to the officer in charge of the police, the animal would be relieved, but if they find that they are not sure, they can give the names and all the facts, and it will be investigated at once.

"Our aim is to prevent cruelty. I try as best I can when any cases come under my notice, or are reported to me, to get the offender into court, and to follow the laws of our late president, J. V. Ellis, and quote from his last address to the executive the following: 'I am grateful at the thought that during my connection with the S. P. C. our society has not sought to deal severely with offenders against the law. We have sought to secure for sufferers of all kinds succor from their troubles, but have not been able to do so without thought of what they have been doing. In some cases it is impossible to teach without some punishing, but these are not many; and mildness, kind advice and sympathy do the work of mercy much more satisfactorily than severe punishment.'

which to many looks to be an overload, but if the teamster will give them their time, and not use the whip unnecessarily, I am in doubt whether I can interfere, but too often the teamster does not do this, and it is then that a word of caution or report to police court is necessary to stop it. The team traffic via the ferry, especially during the winter, is very heavy, and at times there are too many teams to get on the steamer, which means delay, and often suffering of the horses having to stand so long in the cold and storms. The question of a bridge across the harbor is again brought before the public, and if that is carried out it will be a great benefit to the horses, and I hope we will not have to wait much longer for it.

"I am pleased to say that with the exception of four cases there have not been any very cruel acts of ill-treatment to animals reported to this society. I might mention one in which I was called by phone last May between 12 and 1 o'clock at night from Sussex, informing me that a horse had been so over-driven and ill-treated on the road between Amherst and Sussex that it died on the road. After a number of 'phone messages I got the man's name and had a warrant issued for his arrest, but before it was executed the man was sent to the insane asylum and the matter was dropped.

"Mrs. H. G. Fairbanks of Hartcourt, Kent county, has been and is still doing splendid work for us in that district for the last two years, and through her efforts several acts of cruelty to animals have been prevented. I only wish we had more like her in the other sections of the province who would take the same interest she does for the care and protection of our faithful animals. Our best thanks are due to her.

"We have two other very active agents in St. John, S. A. McLeod of Sussex and F. M. Thompson of Hillsboro. Both of these gentlemen have for some years been taken a deep interest in our work and have been the means of preventing many acts of cruelty to animals, and to them are our best thanks due.

"I wish to express my very best thanks to Mr. J. King Kelley, K. C., Mr. Kenneth A. Wilson, Mr. G. Earle Logan and Mr. Geo. A. L. for their valuable legal advice and assistance given me in my work; also Dr. L. A. Donovan, V. P. of the S. P. C., for their valuable advice given so freely when called upon.

"To the chief of police and his officers I wish again to express my very best thanks for their valuable aid and assistance given me in my work, and the society's thanks are due to them. My best thanks are also due to my many friends who have either reported to us or interposed by those in authority.

"As I have stated in previous reports, I am very much indebted to the lady officers of the Animal Rescue League for the splendid work they are doing for the relief of the smaller animals throughout the city. In the many calls I have had from parties as to cats and dogs, secured, injured, or otherwise needing help, I have been very glad to be able to help when they will at once take action for the wants of the animals. For many of the smaller animals are hampered very much in their work. The work they are doing is a very great benefit to the city, but does not seem to be appreciated by those in authority.

The tabulated statement shows 488 cases of which 38 referred to children. Twelve cases were taken to court. L. C. MacNutt, for the Fredericton bank reported the year as active and successful as former ones. The bank balance was about \$200 at Dec. 31. The death of James Roberts was referred to and the appointment of Mr. Hughes to succeed him. He has been doing good work. Miss Jeanette Beverly was commended for her work as secretary-treasurer. The membership list is above 100.

For Moncton, Geo. B. Willett, president and W. A. McNeill, secretary, reported 108 cases dealt with.

Mrs. H. G. Fairbanks of Hartcourt reported on the work of the year and told of the good influence of the S. P. C. She thought more country districts should take up the work.

F. M. Thompson reported for Hillsboro. All in that part of the country seemed to have been going on quietly and correctly during the year.

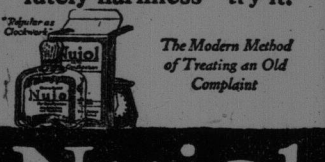
