New York, Oct. 4—Charitable bequests totalling approximately \$1,350,000 are made in the will of Jacob H. Schiff, banker and philanthropist, filed today. named the only legatees are Mortimer Schiff, Oyster Bay, the testator's son, and Frieda Warburg, New York, the testator's daughter. The residuary estate is divided between them share and share alike. Charitable bequests of Mr. Schiff, include—\$500,000 for the federation for the clude—\$500,000 for the federation for the support of Jewish philanthropic societies of New York; \$300,000 for the Montefiere Home; \$150,000 for the Jewish Theological Society, and \$100,000 for the Hebrew Union College of Cincinnati.
