WANTED. An honest and reliable young

tained in Canada. The silver coins are
issued in the form of metal, whence it
is shipped to the United States, whence it
is returned.

The gold coins minted are composed of
eleven-twentieths of pure gold and one-
twentieth of copper. The silver coins are
composed of three-sevenths of pure silver
and four-sevenths of copper, which is
known as sterling silver. The copper coins
are composed of ninety-five per cent. cop-
per, four per cent. tin and one per cent.
zinc.

Great exactness is characteristic of all
the work at the mint. A certain weight
of metal is given out, and a certain
weight of coins must be returned. If one is
missing it is searched for till found. Even
the dust which accumulates is collected and
melted to recover the precious metal it
contains.

The mint is divided into six principal
departments: (1) mint office, where all bul-
lion is received and from which all bul-
lion is issued; (2) coinage department,
where the bullion is melted, and the
made into coinage bars; (3) coining depart-
ment, where the coins are made and test-
ed; (4) assay department, where the
fineness and standard of the coins are as-
certained; (5) die department, where the
dies are made; (6)
mechanical department, where the power
is generated, renews made and repairs
effected.—J. Jones Bell, writing on How
