TIPOS, NO. 102, AGREEMENT

1. This agreement shall be in effect from the first day of July, 1919.

2. It is agreed that the wages to be paid weekly in all offices.

3. The standard hours of work each week shall be 48, and such work shall be completed in five nights.

5. Apprentices to compositors: Two to the first five journeymen and one to each subsequent four or major portion thereof.

6. Beginning with the first week in the fourth year, every apprentice shall pay to the Secretary of Ottawa Typographical Union No. 102 the sum of fifty cents (\$0.50) per week for a period of 60 weeks, which sum shall be applied to the purchase of a course of lessons of instruction in printing recomposed by the printer.

7. In the first year an apprentice may be required to perform general work in the composing room at the discretion of the foreman.

8. Should an apprentice be employed in the composing room at the discretion of the foreman, he shall be employed at least 50 per cent of his time each day at composition and printing.

9. Starting with the third year, apprentices are entitled to and must be in possession of an apprentice working card, endorsed by the Secretary of the local typographical union.

10. In all cases where members are laid off or discharged before the regular day they shall be entitled to, and shall immediately receive, whatever sum may be due them.

Apprentice Regulations

1. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years.

2. When a boy becomes an apprentice in an office he shall, during the first year, appear before the Board of Apprentices and be examined.

3. The minimum scale of wages per week to be paid for the years stated shall be: First two years at the rate of \$11.00 per week.

4. The standard hours of work each week shall be 48, and such work shall be completed in five nights.

5. Apprentices to compositors: Two to the first five journeymen and one to each subsequent four or major portion thereof.

6. Beginning with the first week in the fourth year, every apprentice shall pay to the Secretary of Ottawa Typographical Union No. 102 the sum of fifty cents (\$0.50) per week for a period of 60 weeks, which sum shall be applied to the purchase of a course of lessons of instruction in printing recomposed by the printer.

7. In the first year an apprentice may be required to perform general work in the composing room at the discretion of the foreman.

8. Should an apprentice be employed in the composing room at the discretion of the foreman, he shall be employed at least 50 per cent of his time each day at composition and printing.

9. Starting with the third year, apprentices are entitled to and must be in possession of an apprentice working card, endorsed by the Secretary of the local typographical union.

10. In all cases where members are laid off or discharged before the regular day they shall be entitled to, and shall immediately receive, whatever sum may be due them.

11. No office operated under this agreement shall have work done in a non-union office, or in an office where a strike exists, and no such office shall accept any work from such non-union office, or office in which a strike exists.

12. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to operate as a reduction in the salaries paid to present employees, or as requiring an employer to retain unnecessary or incompetent help.

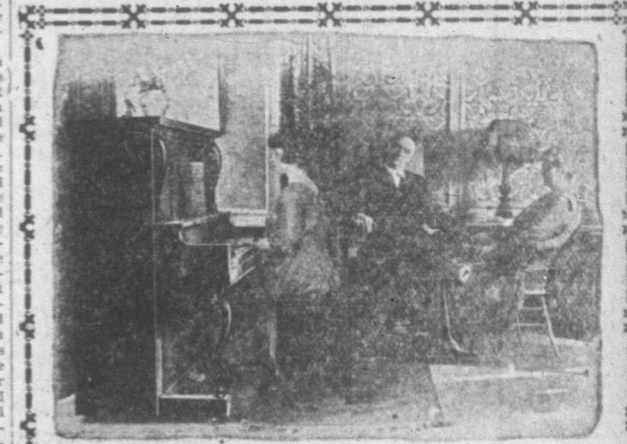

ACROSS THE ATLANTIC

LABOR AGAINST CONSCRIPTION. Without a dissenting vote the Labor Conference at Southampton, England, adopted a resolution condemning conscription and recommending that the Trade Union Congress of Great Britain take immediate industrial action to abolish it.

OPPOSES COMPULSORY UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE. Compulsory unemployment insurance was opposed by British trade unionists representing over 700,000 workers, affiliated with the General Federation of Trade Unions, at a special council meeting in London.

44-HOUR WEEK FOR FARM WORKERS. The National Union of Agricultural Laborers in Great Britain has called a conference to meet at the end of the year, for the consideration of the following problems: Forty-four hour week for the year around; minimum wage of 4s. 6d. per week; overtime pay only when absolutely necessary, apart from hay-making, time and harvest; overtime paid at time and a half rate; double rates for Sunday work.

BRITISH RECONSTRUCTION OF INDUSTRY. This is the line along which British industry is to be reconstructed. An illustration of the way which the thing will work out is the first step, is shown in a plan adopted at a conference between the trade unions and the National Industrial Reconstruction Association.

PROTESTS AGAINST INTERVENTION IN RUSSIA. British, French and Italian labor representatives have decided to make a general demonstration on July 29, or 21, to protest against Allied intervention in Russia.

WINNIPEG METAL AND BUILDING TRADES RETURN

Winnipeg metal and building trades strikers resumed work on Wednesday morning. Consideration was given to the possibility of a strike at once if a deal could not be struck.

STREET RAILWAYMEN WILL SURELY GET SOMETHING. Last Thursday afternoon the Grievance Committee of the Street Railway Workers' Union, headed by President John Kipling, waited on General Superintendent George E. Waller.
