LAKE FISHERMEN ARE HAVING GREAT LUCK

Their Nets Filled to Overflowing Every Day This Year—Protection Responsible for This Gratifying Result.

CLEVELAND, O., July 8.—For the past decade there has been a gradual falling off in the quantity of fish caught in the Great Lakes. This year, however, the nets of the fish companies all along the Chain of Lakes have almost invariably been overrunning with fish when lifted.

RUSSIA HOPES JAPAN WILL GET A GOOD BEATING

ST. PETERSBURG, July 8.—A despatch to the official News agency from Tokyo says that Baron Goto, the Japanese Imperial Commissioner in China, and President of the South Manchuria Ry., ascribes the unfavorable attitude of the foreign press towards Japanese procedure in Manchuria mostly to prejudice, but he recognizes that the rough methods of the Japanese soldiers were also responsible for the criticism.

The Novoe Vremya also indicates that Russia will be forced to observe a neutral attitude.
