THIS CANADIAN RED MAN LEADS IN PEACE DANCE. S. F. Cody, Whose Machine Was Condemned by the War Office, is Now Being Court-ed for a New Contract.

HIS MACHINE AN EYE OPENER. BITTER-SOUR CHANTS SERVICE.

London, Oct. 8.—S. F. Cody, the aeronaut, has completely turned the tables upon his critics. A few weeks ago when he met with a series of disheartening mishaps he received scarcely any sympathy from the War Office, the press or the public.

Little Support. But all along the support Mr. Cody received from the government was small. Its expenditure upon the machine and experiments was only \$5,000.

Notwithstanding the lack of public and official support, Mr. Cody remained undaunted. He persevered with his experiments and before long astounded his critics by flying a thousand yards following a target with flights of greater distances.

Public opinion immediately swung around and now the government is being condemned for its ungenerous treatment of Mr. Cody, who it is affirmed, would have met with earlier success had he received the same measure of support and encouragement.

WANTED TO LEARN OF HIS IDENTITY. Unknown Man Enters Bellevue Hospital For Treatment But Falls Down Under First Question.

New York, N. Y., Oct. 8.—A young man walked into Bellevue Hospital early yesterday morning and asked for medical treatment.

"What's your name?" he was asked, "puzzled look came into his face. 'That's just the trouble,' he replied, 'I have forgotten it. I have had it on the tip of my tongue all the evening, but it won't come. I'd recognize it in a minute if I heard it.'"
