**Loved Clerk; Tried to Murder Husband**



Wheeling, W. Va., Nov. 16.—John O. Schenk, millman and work packer, is in the hospital here, slowly recovering from the effects of poison which almost killed him.  
 His wife, a poor girl when he married her 12 years ago, has been arrested and awaits a preliminary hearing on a charge of attempting to poison him.

Their two children, ignorant of both facts, are being cared for by Schenk's brother.  
 Detectives employed by Schenk's suspicious relatives unearthed the evidence which led to Mrs. Schenk's arrest. It is charged that systematic doses of arsenic administered in food or drink, gradually brought Schenk to death's door. Samples of lily water in the Schenk home were analyzed and shown to contain considerable quantities of arsenic.

One detective, disguised as a nurse, is said to have been offered \$1000 to put arsenic in Schenk's medicine, even after he was taken to the hospital. Another, acting as chauffeur, is said to have been offered \$1,000 to take Schenk out in his auto and run him in a ditch. The same chauffeur will testify to several trips taken by Mrs. Schenk to Belaire, it is said.

Another arrest, that of "the man in the case," is predicted by the prosecutor. This man and the desire to prematurely acquire Schenk's millions, are the motives alleged for the crime.  
 Mrs. Schenk denies all the charges. When told, on his hospital cot, of his wife's arrest, Schenk broke into sobs. "Oh, Laura, Laura," he cried, turned his face to the wall and absolutely refused to talk.

 At a meeting of the directors of the St. John Railway Company, held on Monday, it was decided to make a cut in the price of gas for heating, cooking or manufacturing purposes. The present rate is \$1.30 per thousand with ten cents discount for prompt payment, and it was decided to make a net rate of \$1.10 per thousand with the discount continued, which will make a net rate of \$1 per thousand. The directors will open a room for demonstration purposes with an operator in charge, who will show how to cook with gas. H. M. Hopper in discussing the cut said it was not made because there had been a decrease in the cost of producing gas, but with the hope that the use of gas for heating and cooking purposes would be popularized and new customers secured thereby.
