Waterford, Ireland, Mar. 23—The election of Captain William Redmond to the house over Dr. White, a Sinn Feiner, was accompanied by disorders here which lasted all night. Crowds of men and women paraded the streets. Windows were broken, fire arms were used and twenty persons were injured. One of these is Dr. White, who was hit on the head with a brick when the result of the election was announced. Captain Redmond was cheered by crowds, Joseph Devlin, a prominent Nationalist member of parliament, in a speech from a window of a hotel, said Waterford had struck a blow for the honor of Ireland. Captain Redmond said a triumph had been gained for the policy of sanity and common sense in Irish affairs.
