Council of Women Met Yesterday

Discussed Housing Conditions in City—Serbian Relief Worker Present—Date Decided for National Council Meeting at St. John.

A meeting of the Local Council of Women was held last evening in the King's Daughters' Guild, Mrs. E. Atherton Smith presiding. The date for the National Council meeting to be held in St. John was decided upon as June 2nd.

Miss Eacey, treasurer, reported \$21.81 on hand, and in the Fountain Fund \$44. It was decided to insure the fountain.

Mrs. E. Edmund Raymond gave a splendid report for the financial committee of Rosebud Day. The amount of \$2,612.77 was collected, and expenses were \$40. A generous merchant had paid the expenses. The York and Cornwall Cotton Mills were thanked for a donation of twelve, and W. Donnelly for coaching.

Mrs. T. N. Vincent reported on the visit of herself and Mrs. Makahy to the S. P. C. to find out how regarding the punishment of neglected parents. J. King Kelley had stated that there is a fine of \$100 or two years' imprisonment for such crimes. It was felt that the bad housing conditions and bad treatment of women by drunken husbands were frequently responsible for neglected children, and the question was asked why the Board of Health did not enforce the laws regarding sanitary arrangements and cleanliness. Mrs. Vincent suggested that if a loan were floated for a fund

capital building it should be made for a large enough amount to build a model tenement, and give estimates and particulars of several such in London and Dublin. It was felt that measures must be taken to remedy the frightful conditions which prevail, and Dr. Roberts will be asked to address the January meeting.

On motion, the annual meeting will be held the last week in January. Mrs. J. W. V. Lawlor gave an account of the National Executive meeting held in Hamilton, which she attended, telling of several resolutions and of how she voted upon them. These included proxy votes, a resolution asking all trains to make provisions for mothers to care for their children, and a resolution regarding the personal laying of resolutions passed by the Council before the Legislature, so that they may not be simply received and laid aside.

The work of Mrs. W. Edmund Raymond on the Vocational Committee was highly commended by the Council.

Mrs. Olive M. Aldrich, who was in St. John last April in the interests of Serbian Relief, and who accompanied the Serbian Army on their retreat as a nurse, was introduced to the meeting by Mrs. W. Edmund Raymond and gave a brief account of her visit in Canada. She said she had been delighted to meet so many representative women, and that she felt she had learned so much from them. The Serbian Hospital Fund had been most generously contributed to. Mrs. Aldrich is a member of the Town Planning and Housing Council in England, and offered to send any literature on the subject that would be of service to St. John.
