PILOT DROWNED IN RIVER NEAR HOPEWELL CAPE

Capt. Warren Franx Met Death Early Saturday Morning in Tragic Manner—Trouble in Getting Boat to Go to His Assistance.

Clinging hopelessly to a boat hook, which he was grasping when picked up, Capt. Warren Franx, pilot of Hopewell Cape, lost his life in the chill waters of the Pettaucodet river at an early hour Saturday morning.

Captain Dixon left his home in the evening and went down to the breakwater to tend his boat so that he could get an early start on the next flood tide, as he intended going to Hillsboro with a boat-load of water for the steamer Franx.

The body was taken to the Wilfrid C. Hill, one of the most prominent men in the section and one of the best known men in New Brunswick, died about 8 o'clock Saturday morning at his home.
