RIVERS, MAN.—C.N.R. MISHAP INVESTIGATION

Question No. 1,882—**Mr. Skoberg:**

Has the Canadian Transport Commission completed their investigation into the mishap on the C.N.R. Rivers subdivision on April 28, 1968, where three employees were killed when the engine went through the bridge and, if so, what were the findings of the investigation?

**Hon. Donald C. Jamieson (Minister of Transport):** The Canadian Transport Commission advises as follows: The Canadian Transport Commission has not yet completed its investigation into the accident.

#### NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS

Question No. 1,962—**Mr. Robinson:**

1. How many nuclear power plants are there in Canada (a) where is each located (b) what is the present power output of each, and (c) what is the power potential of each?

2. How many additional nuclear power plants are proposed during the next five, ten and fifteen years, where will they be located and what power potential is anticipated from each?

3. Is it the intention of the federal government to provide nuclear power for export purposes?

4. Is it the intention of the federal government to provide nuclear power to take the place of coal?

5. What is Canada's capacity, at the present time, to provide heavy water?

6. What is the government's program to increase the production of heavy water?

**Hon. Otto E. Lang (Minister without Portfolio):** Atomic Energy of Canada Limited advises as follows: 1. (a) (b) (c): The following nuclear power plants are in operation with the power output and power potential indicated: (i) Nuclear Power Demonstration Station; Rolphton, Ontario, 25 megawatts, 25 megawatts; (ii) Douglas Point Generating Station, Douglas Point, Ontario, 210 megawatts, 210 megawatts (This Station is shut down at the present time for annual maintenance.)

2. The following nuclear power plants are committed: (i) AECL's 250 megawatt nuclear

generating station being constructed in co-operation with Hydro-Quebec at Gentilly, Quebec; (ii) Ontario Hydro's 2,000 megawatt station being constructed at Pickering, Ontario; (iii) Ontario Hydro's 3,000 megawatt generating station being constructed at Douglas Point, Ontario.

3. No. (If by this question is meant the export of power plants, AECL is engaged in an export marketing program.)

(i) The government, through AECL, has contractually undertaken to underwrite the sale of all heavy water produced; (a) by the Deuterium of Canada Limited 400-ton per annum plant under construction at Glace Bay, Nova Scotia; and (b) by the Canadian General Electric Company Limited 400-ton per annum plant under construction at Port Hawkesbury, Nova Scotia; (ii) The government, through AECL, is constructing an 800-ton per annum heavy water production plant at Douglas Point, Ontario.
