M., 1881, Eliza, youngest dau. of James A. Dennison, Esq., Judge of Probate, Co. of Digby. Called to the Bar, N.S., 1879, and has been Crown Prosecutor for the Co. of Digby since 1887. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Liberal.—*Digby, N.S.*

CORBY, HENRY (*West Hastings*).

Family came to Can. from Hanwell, Co. of Middlesex, Eng. B. in Belleville, 2 May, 1851, and ed. at the Common School there, and at Rockwood Academy, Ont. Took commercial course at Bryant & Stratton's Commercial Coll., Toronto. M., 23 Sept., 1872, Maria Courtney, of Belleville. Is a miller, distiller and importer of wines. Was first Asst. Chief Belleville Fire Dept.; and is now Presdt. of Ramblers' Bicycle Club, Bay of Quinte Yacht Club, Forest and Stream Club, and of the Cricket Club; and a dir. of the Bay of Quinte Agricultural Exhibition, and Vice-Presdt. of the Bay of Quinte Bridge Co., and Presdt. of Belleville Hotel Co. First returned to Parlt. by acclamation at by-election, held 17 March, 1888, and re-elected at g. e., 1891 and 1896. A Conservative.—*Belleville, Ont.; Rideau Club.*

B. at St. Nicholas, P.Q., 1st Feb., 1835. Ed. at St. Ann's Coll. M., 1855, Harriet, dau. of Mr. J. R. Ryan, of Grand Falls, N.B. Has been Registrar of Deeds for Victoria, and Judge of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, N.B. Sat for present seat in N.B. Assem. from 1861 to 1866, when defeated. Returned to Commons at the Union; re-elected at g. e., 1872,
