If I am permitted to confine myself to the instructions conveyed in Your letter of the 29th Oct^r last and which I announced to the Indians as final, the result on the whole will be satisfactory to all concerned —

Referring to your letter of the 24th Oct^r, addressed to the Deputy Superintendent of Indian Affairs, I have the honor to inform you that Mr. Superintendent Bartlett was by letter of the 10th Oct^r duly authorized to sell, at the Inspector's valuation, the lots named and exhibited on the sketch sent through him by you on behalf of Mr. Resper. But he was, at the same time, informed that it was not advisable to sell portions only of particular lots, as very probably it would interfere with the sale of the other parts.

I may add to the above that Mr. Bartlett was also desired to state to you that this Depart^t has no power authority to close the streets in the Town Plot of Brooke, as requested by Mr. Stedman that being a question resting altogether with the Municipality —
